

TOLA BARS

MAINLY FOR INDIAN SUB-CONTINENT AND MIDDLE EAST

This supplement covers cast and minted tola bars manufactured or issued by refiners that are accredited to one or more of the associations and exchanges featured on this website, or issued by international bullion dealers.

Total: 24 bars from 10 refiners and issuers.

BACKGROUND

The tola is a traditional **Indian** unit of weight. 1 tola = 0.375 oz (11.6638 g). It is a Hindi word, derived from the Sanskrit word "tula", defined as a balance, scale or weight. The unit was introduced by England's East India Company in 1836.

Although the gram is India's official unit of weight, the tola continues to be used in the Indian Sub-Continent, and in the Middle East.

Tola bars traditionally have a millesimal gold purity of 999, but 999.9 bars are also manufactured. A serial number is not normally stamped on the bar.

For more than 50 years, the small 10 tola cast bar (3.75 oz) was the most popular bar in India. Over the period 1990-2002 alone, more than 40 million 10 tola bars were imported into India.

In 2003, however, when tola-denominated cast bars were taxed upon import at a higher rate than gram-denominated cast bars, demand for imported 10 tola bars declined dramatically in favour of 1000 g and 100 g bars.

Tola bars are also manufactured in other weights: 5 tola cast bars, and 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 tola minted bars – when round in shape, they are normally referred to as "coins" in India and the Middle East.
